Frequently Asked Questions

Where is the project located?

The I-10 Desert Rehab Project is a 13-mile segment of the I-10 freeway near Coachella in Riverside County, covering the portion from 1.8 miles east of the Dillon Road Interchange to 2 miles east of the Cactus City Rest Area.

Aside from roadway paving, what are the additional benefits of the project?

Other than repairing and restoring existing roadway pavement and adding an eastbound truck climbing lane, the I-10 Desert Rehab Project will install electric vehicle charging stations at the Cactus City Rest Area, replace and upgrade bridge railings, guardrail systems, and roadway signage, and improve roadway infrastructure including drainage and storm water treatment systems.

What major destinations/events maybe affected by construction?

The project team is aware of music festivals and events taking place annually throughout the Coachella Valley. Advanced notification of possible traffic delays along I-10 will be distributed to event organizers well in advance of all major events. To confirm that your event organizers will be notified, contact us via the project email (see previous).

How long is construction going to last?

The project will take approximately 3.5 years to complete. Construction is anticipated to begin in late 2022.

Will access along the I-10 be severely impacted?

Caltrans, along with the contractor, will maintain eastbound and westbound travel along I-10 through the project area during construction. Occasional nighttime lane closures and lane shifts associated with construction activity may create some traffic delays, but eastbound and westbound access will be maintained. Full directional closures may be implemented in the event of an emergency, but are not anticipated.

Will bicycle access along the I-10 be impacted?

Yes, bicycle access along I-10 will be impacted, but maintained during stage 2 of construction (approximately Fall 2023). Cyclists will be detoured at the Dillon Road interchange on the west side of the project and at the Cottonwood Springs Road interchange on the east side. The detour route uses the new Coachella Valley Link bike path and Painted Canyon Road.
